Component: Attendance

Students can earn a maximum of 10 points for this component. To calculate their score for this component, the total number of absences will be multiplied by .2 and then subtracted from 10. The lowest score possible is zero, and will be assigned to any student with 50 or more absences.

E.g. A student who is absent 15 days will receive 7 points because $15 \times .2 = 3$.

Component: Punctuality*

Students can earn a maximum of 10 points for this component. To calculate their score for this component, the total number of days late will be multiplied by .2 and then subtracted from 10. The lowest score possible is zero, and will be assigned to any student with 50 or more absences.

E.g. A student who is late 5 days will receive 9 points because $5 \times .2 = 1$.

Component: Subject Area Grades**

Students can earn a maximum of 8-10 points per subject for this component. To calculate their score for each subject area, the student's grades will be converted to a 100 point scale in accordance with DOE Academy Policy guidelines. This will then be reduced to a fraction over one hundred, and multiplied by the total number of possible points.

K497M EXAMPLE: A student with a 75 in ELA will receive 6 out of 8 possible points for the French Dual Language program because $.75 \times 8 = 6$.

K497S EXAMPLE: A student with a 75 in ELA will receive 7.5 out of 10 possible points for the K497S Program because $.75 \times 10 = 7.5$.

Component: State Math and ELA Test Scores***

Students can earn a maximum of 20 points for each exam in this component. To calculate their score for this component, the scale below will be used to assign points for each exam.

Exam Score	1.00-2.00	2.01-2.33	2.34-2.67	2.67+
Points Awarded (K497M)	0	7.5	11.25	15
Points Awarded (K497S)	0	10	15	20

*Families are encouraged to share rationales for excessive absences or tardiness. School absence or tardiness that is excused will be removed from the calculation for the absence and lateness metric.

**In the absence of NYC DOE grades, the Academic Policy conversion chart will be used. In the absence of an individual grade, an ELA course mark will be used as a replacement. E.g., a student missing a social studies or science mark will have his/her ELA course mark inserted.

***Note, if student test scores are missing, the student's ELA and/or Math grades will be used in their respective places. The methodology for the Subject Area Grades will be applied.
